CONGRATULATIONS TO TEAM ETHIOPIA AT THE TOKYO OLYMPICS

Solomon Berega has won the first Gold Medal for Ethiopia for the 10,000 meter run. Silver for Lamecha Girma in the men's 3000m steeplechase race and Bronze for Gudaf Tsegay in the women's 5000m race! Congratulations to all! Other winners may yet to come as Ethiopia is well represented at the Olympics.

World record-holders Letesenbet Gidey is also among the 34 athletes named on Ethiopia's team for the Tokyo Olympic Games. The team also includes world indoor 1500m champion Samuel Tefera and world silver medallist Yomif Kejelcha.

AN AFTERNOON WITH ALEX TEFERA; CARTOONIST AND ANIMATOR

July 6th started off as sunny and art students and other enthusiasts gathered to wait to meet the talented Alemayehu Tefera (Alex) in the discussion room at Entoto TEVET College. The students and the coordinator Hailu Kifle showed their appreciation and anticipation by organizing a small display of their own cartoon art work on the walls of the discussion room accompanied by the fantastic drawings of the artist himself. The works of art displayed were the fruits of just one semester course. Getting to know the brilliant Alex began with a short introduction and hear him read from his recent book "Funtezya". Alex then delighted his audience by sharing his experiences here in Ethiopia; in Addis Ketema his childhood neighborhood, Alle Fine Art School in Amist Killo and in the UK where he currently lives. He shared his artistic journey emphasizing how one visual artist should focus on daily sketching. For Alex, an artist's sketch book and pen/ pencil should be essential items to carry in all walks of his/her life. Alex attributed his own success as the result of sketching since the age of 12.

The discussion carried on for hours about Alemayehu and his life, including a visit to Ethiopia in 2005; a visit that determined his artistic journey through his cartoons depicting socio political collections now published in his book which he launched in June 2021 in Addis Ababa. The freedom of expression we see in his socio political cartoons and strongly depicted emotions and opinions have been displayed through different social media outlets. His experiences led him to seek freedom through expression in his cartoons.

Personally I would recommend the book for humor and an understanding of the depiction of the socio political situations that he felt compelled to share. The book is available to buy around town.

ETHIOPIA ILLUSTRATED: MANUSCRIPTS AND PAINTINGS IN ETHIOPIA.

A study on the wall paintings of the Ethiopian Orthodox Tewahedo Church, and religious and genealogical history. A very rare book for Ethiopian academics and University students who could not easily get access to materials put out by prestigious scientific journals across the world. Author Dr. Dorothea McEwan, is a senior Ethiopic scholar who has established herself through a sustained research on the history of the 19th century church Art. She is Honorary Fellow of the University of London, first and long-time archivist at The Warburg Institute, and has been elected member of the Ethiopian Academy of Sciences in recognition of her impressive publication record and outstanding contribution to research in the intersection of religious history and art in Ethiopia in 2017.

The volume makes available seven articles grouped in two parts—the first analyzing art produced by Ethiopian artists on sacred topics, and the second discussing the botanist Georg Wilhelm Schimper's map—making and the draughtsman Eduard Zander's pictorial representations of scenes of everyday life in mid nineteenth—century Ethiopia. Each chapter is richly illustrated, presenting paintings alongside commentaries on their religious, social, and historical contexts.

This work also complements analysis of manuscripts by European scientists, craftspeople, artists, and explorers who had worked in Ethiopia, and whose records are now kept in archives and collections in Europe.



CRUSH CAFÉ AND RESTAURANT: TEFF PIZZA AND MORE

The first thing that captures the imagination when entering Crush Café and restaurant is the striking green mosaic. The high ceiling creates an airy casual atmosphere with light pouring in through the floor-length window. It is a surprisingly ambient environment perfect for a quick meeting or an informal meeting. In an area defined by a hectic level of noise, it felt peaceful. The menu is selective including a Chicken Teff pizza, spicy steak sandwich, and selection of Ethiopian dishes. The Chicken Teff pizza and the combo meal, which includes a tagliatelle pasta with bolognese, steak, and roasted vegetables is especially worth a try. The pizza is a creative take with two thin layers of teff dough sandwiched with a cheese layer. The toppings included diced chicken, olives, and tomatoes all doused in cheese. It does not disappoint. If not in the mood for a full meal there are a variety of snacks available. On the other hand, why not go for a drink. The barista makes great concoctions of coffee variety, shakes or the selection of fresh fruit/vegetable juices available are worth a try. For the daring or health oriented the beetroot juice is wonderful.

ETHIOPIAN AUTHOR WINS PRESTIGIOUS LITERARY AWARD

Meron Hadero has become the first Ethiopian author to win the prestigious AKO Caine Prize for African Writing. "I'm absolutely thrilled, I'm in shock - being shortlisted in itself was a huge honour," Her winning short story "The Street Sweep" is about an Ethiopian boy called Getu, who has to navigate the fraught power dynamics of NGOs and foreign aid in Addis Ababa. It impressed the judges who found it "utterly without self-pity" and said it "turns the lens" on the usual clichés. The author was born in Ethiopia and raised in the US by parents who are both medical doctors. Her sister is the singer Meklit Hadero, whose support was "absolutely essential" to her success, Hadero says. She says stories of "refugees, immigrants and those at risk of being displaced" are always the "entry-point emotionally" to her work.

"With The Street Sweep, he has that threat looming. He's facing losing his ancestral home, and that's the real driver of the story that makes him take charge and try to re-write that outcome that seems kind of inevitable," said Hadero. Much of The Street Sweep is set in Addis Ababa's Sheraton hotel, where Getu is invited for a party. "Looking through his eyes it's almost a culture shock when he goes there," Hadero said. "I did want to paint that contrast... What does that access mean? And what does that bestow? That's the bigger question of what those open doors represent. Writing short stories has been "it's own love" for the author, who likened the form to a "contained laboratory" from which "pared down and elegant" tales can emerge. Her next challenge is her debut novel, which "is really fun to work on in a different way. "You're adding and you're exploring mess."

COFFEE FARMER TAMIRU TADESSE WINS PRESIDENTIAL AWARD

Ethiopian coffee growers made record high profits during this year's Cup of Excellence Ethiopia auction!! On top of bringing home a record-breaking 80 million Birr back to Ethiopia, the coffee grown by this year's competition winner, Tamiru Tadesse Tesema, sold for an astonishing 14,500 Birr per kilo! (All told, Tamiru made over 15 million Birr with his incredible coffee.) Tamiru Tadesse is a coffee supplier who has been in the coffee business for the past eight years. He works with around 200 farmers in Delo kebele, Bensa zone of the Sidama region. He collects about 182,000 kilograms of red cherry beans from an estimated 80 hectares of land owned by the farmers. Tamiru processes anaerobic and natural coffee which is dried on a raised bed with mesh wire. He then sells his coffee on the international market, mostly to China. However, he says, he was interested to acquire new market destinations and promote the unique flavors of Bensa coffee. "We participated in the Cup of Excellence 2021 to promote the coffee our farmers grow and to establish better market linkage and improve the farmers' income. The coffee we grow in our area is of a very high quality. I wanted to promote it and that is why I took part in the competition," says Tesema. "I am very happy for having the opportunity and very honored to have won the Presidential Award. It is the greatest acknowledgment for our hard work." The results for the 2021 Ethiopia Cup of Excellence competition were released by the Ethiopian Coffee and Tea Authority, Ethiopian Coffee Exporters Association, Feed the Future Ethiopia Value Chain Activity (VCA), and Alliance for Coffee Excellence. Out of the 40 finalists, five coffee lots score 90 points or more, earning the highest recognition in the competition, the Presidential Award.

MOTHER TERESA OF AFRICA:DR. ABEBECH GOBENA

After a lifetime of compassionate and dedicated work, Dr. Gobena sadly passed away at the age of 85 in July 2021. Born in a small rural village in 1938, she was raised by her grandparents. On a pilgrimage to Gishen Mariam in Wollo during the dreadful famine period, she witnessed terrible suffering and hunger and at a feeding center she observed a small malnourished child on the breast of her mother who had died. Filled with compassion, she took the child along with another orphan home with her back to Addis. Within the year she had 21 orphaned children (from the famine) living with her. Initially to help food and clothe the children, she sold her jewellery and made and sold injera and other food. Over time she received support and funding and in 1986 she was able to establish the association of AGOHELMA (Abebech Gobena Child Care and Development Association) an orphanage which also provides services to the community such as formal and non-formal education, HIV/AIDS prevention activities, habitat improvement and infrastructure development and empowerment of women. For the past 41 years, the organisation has supported more than 12,000 needy children with an additional 1.5 million people who have benefitted either directly or indirectly throughout the country. Her aim was to mould needy children into productive and responsible citizens to be able to support themselves and contribute to society. The students learned sewing, knitting and weaving, metalwork, plumbing, electricity, photography and silkscreen printing. As well as babies and children, she was always deeply troubled by poverty, hunger and people who never had the chance for an education.

Poverty alleviation programs were a major aspect of her work. For her unreserved humanitarian efforts and achievements, she received numerous awards and accolades from various national and international forums.

Much loved and respected all over the world, she was a remarkable woman with a passion for humanity; her numerous achievements will never be forgotten.



ELLENE MOCRIA 1941-2021: VETERAN RADIO AND TELEVSION. JOURNALIST REMEMBERED

Ellene Mocria, one of the first Ethiopian female radio and TV journalists, has passed away from cancer aged 79.

When an advertisement came out that English announcers were needed for the new External Services of Radio Ethiopia to be transmitted to Europe and parts of Africa. Ellene applied, passed and was hired in 1962. Ellene was the first female newscaster and producer when the Voice of Ethiopia began daily English broadcasts to Europe and West Africa in 1962 and became the first female television journalist in Ethiopia in 1964. She became one of the first two women journalists who were hired for the External Services of the Voice of Ethiopia as it was then known. As a radio journalist, she started presenting the news live and produced and presented a variety of programs. She produced a program in 1988 on the subject 'Shelter for the Homeless' which won an award by the UNHCR.

Ellene was the first person to ever appear on Ethiopian Television when it first started transmission on March 12, 1977. She worked both in radio and television for many years but eventually was only on TV as Program Producer/ Presenter, Newscaster and among the TV programs she presented live the most famous one was TVMAG, a weekly half-hour magazine program of interviews with well-known national and international personalities and featured current events. Eleni was then encouraged to apply at the Radio Voice of Gospels station (RVOG). "Working for RVOG, was the best years of my career. As a radio journalist, I had the freedom to produce my weekly programs and I also presented the News in English for Europe and parts of Africa. Unfortunately, RVOG was nationalized after a year". In 1997 Eleni became a BBC correspondent in Ethiopia and learned about journalism in the digital age. She filed over 60 programs on various subjects up to June 2012. Other engagements included narrating documentary films for EAL (ET) and for the ETO. Among many things in her illustrious career, Ellene was involved in the formation of the Ethiopian Media Women Association (EMWA) for journalists working in all types of media.



1. Thick Fluid

During winter, various car fluids like the engine oil, transmission fluid, coolant, even the wiper fluid increase in density and viscosity and decrease efficiency of fluids because of molecule contractions. These may damage internal seals and create a loss in power. Symptoms include cold-cranking issues, head gasket leakage and low engine temperatures. We recommend you warm the car up for 10-15 minutes before your first trip initially.

2. Cracked Spark Plug

The cold temps leads to possible cracks, corrosion and loss of electrodes of the spark plug. This leads to the loss of car efficiency and partial combustion inside the engine. These issues may cause difficulty with starting and while driving the car. Symptoms include sluggish acceleration and performance, poor fuel economy and visible corrosion on the spark plug. We recommend you check out the spark plugs and replace with a new (and original) one.

3. Worn Alternator Belt

The Alternator belt for an engine is the main accessory for rotating parts like the water pump, alternator, AC and other parts from the crank shaft. If the belt is failing or has become damaged the rotation won't be effective. The belt may be cracked or you might hear a squealing sound while starting which indicates that you have a worn belt.

4. Low Tyre Pressure

During the winter period, the car tyre pressure drops one psi for every 10-degree temperature drop. Symptoms include low tyre pressure, bulged out or cracked sidewalls and visible punctures and tears. We recommend you check your pressure once a day or use the 12v portable Tyre inflator.

5. Dead battery

Typical lead-acid car battery loses about 10% of its charge capacity in the winter. It can even lead up to a completely dead battery. Most of the time car with dead battery symptom be like Starting problems in the early hours of the morning, Corrosion on the battery terminals, Electricals's accessories fluctuating or not working and decrease in efficiency of the engine while driving.



- 225G (80Z) SOFT BUTTER OR OIL, PLUS EXTRA TO GREASE
- 225G (80Z) BROWN SUGAR
- 225G (80Z) SELF-RAISING FLOUR
- 1 TSP BAKING POWDER (OR 1 TBSPN IF NOT USING SR FLOUR)
- 4 LARGE EGGS
- 50G (20Z) WALNUTS

FOR THE COFFEE ICING

- 30ML (2 TBSP) STRONG COFFEE
- 175G (6OZ) SOFT BUTTER
- 350G (120Z) ICING/CONFECTIONERS' SUGAR
- 50G (20Z) WALNUTS

METHOD...

- 1. Pre-heat the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4, then butter and line the base of two deep 20cm (8in) sandwich cake tins
- 2. Add all the cake ingredients, except the Coffee and walnuts, into a large mixing bowl and beat together until smooth. Stir in the Coffee until thoroughly blended then carefully fold in the walnuts. Divide the mixture evenly between the two prepared tins and level the tops.
- 3. Bake in the oven for 25-30 minutes or until golden brown and shrinking away from the sides of the tin. The sponge should spring back when lightly pressed. Cool on a wire rack before icing.
- 4. To make the icing, beat the butter and icing sugar together in a mixing bowl until smooth. Beat in the Coffee and divide the mixture into two. Place one cake on a cake stand and spread on half of the icing. Top with the other cake, finishing with a layer of the icing on top. Place
