FRIENDSHIP SQUARE IS A LANDMARK DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE BEAUTIFYING SHEGER PROJECT

It contains an artificial lake, a plaza that can accommodate tens of thousands of people at one time, several restaurants and areas for sports activities. The Chinese supported Beautifying Sheger Project has been transformed into an "earthly paradise" in a short period of time. So stated Afomia Solomon, an advisor for the Project, also adding that the project "has opened up green spaces in a city that was increasingly grasping for a clean environment". The main purpose of the project is to clean the river (a 12-km long river treatment) and also to develop the riverside areas in the city for recreation. This includes Friendship Square.

The recreational avenue, which lies on around 30-hectares of land, was constructed by the Chinese construction giant, China Communications Construction Company (CCCC) and is expected to eventually accompany a Palace of Science and Technology, a wedding garden and a children's park.



While Solomon is delighted at the physical structures installed inside the Friendship Square, the speed of construction by the CCCC has motivated her to double down on visions for the project. "The project was initiated by Prime Minister Abiy Ahmed two years ago. Within eight months, the first phase of the project was constructed and completed by CCCC," she said. "It's very amazing how a project can be accomplished in such a short period of time with this level of quality," Solomon further added.

Addis Ababa has in recent years witnessed a rapidly declining number of green spaces, as open areas are increasingly taken up for real estate and similar other purposes. Dagmawi Fikre, a native of Addis Ababa and an employee of CCCC in the Beautifying Sheger Project, said he is glad to play a part in re-greening the city which was turning into a concrete jungle in recent years. "We are undertaking projects as the city's name implies, we're making it a new flower," Fikre told Xinhua recently. "The Chinese have taught us through this project good work ethic, the importance of giving proper attention to my job and the importance of work punctuality," he said.

BATIK ARTIST NUNU YILMA

How did you become interested in Batik?

"I became interested in batik after being exposed to textile art while working as a graphic designer. I have been practicing batik for the past 6 years and I continue to learn and master this ancient art form".

 Are you a textile designer or artist by career or do you work with Ethiopian designers?

"I am a textile artist which means my focus is on creating artwork on fabric. I usually create simple clothing with my batik fabrics such as kaftans, tunic tops, and scarfs. For the 2021 collection, I was lucky enough to work with Yefkir Designs and Fikirte created beautiful dresses and tops as well as men's shirts. I also have collaborated with Zewde & Undken in creating leather bags out of my batik fabrics".

 How do you make your dyes- are you able to use any natural methods?

"I currently use fiber reactive dyes which are very ecofriendly and low toxic. I also use natural bees wax that I source from bee keepers here in Addis Ababa. My dyeing process is environmentally friendly as I use cold water, salt, & soda ash (fabric detergent)".





• Do Batik dyes adhere well to traditional Ethiopian cotton fabric?

"Ethiopian fabric dyes very beautifully, as most of our fabrics are made out of natural fibers. All our fabrics at Ethiopian Batik are sourced from weavers here in Addis. Ethiopia has a long history in creating fabrics on traditional looms. Being able to work on handwoven fabrics, is really exciting for me as the result is stunning and does not match any machine-made fabric".

• In today's world of unsustainable Fast Fashion, are your techniques and products able to be as eco and environmentally friendly as possible?

"I recently opened a store called Hanubet with my business partner Haymanot Honelegn. Our store focuses on handmade and sustainable products. All our clothing is made by hand from start to finish. We start creating fabrics by working with weavers and then dye and paint each fabric by hand. Each piece is carefully designed and tailored to be one of a kind item. In addition to clothing, Hanubet also carries jewelry, scarfs, and home accessories".

• Do you teach Batik to others?

"I currently have one assistant that is on her way to becoming a strong batik artist. I plan on giving small courses in the future to introduce batik to the Ethiopian community".

THE ETHIOPIAN CALENDAR UNRAVELLED

Keep u to date with both Ethiopian and Ferengie dates and Holidays with the Tesfa Calendar. Roll on the thirteenth month as we say farewell to 2013 and welcome in 2014 in the Ethiopian Calendar.


The origin if the Ethiopian Calendar is shrouded in the mists of time. However it is very much the same as the ancient solar Coptic calendar from Egypt, which is the oldest in history. It is believed that the famous Imhotep, the supreme official of King Djoser C.2670 B.C. played a part in the development of this calendar. Going further back the ancient Egyptians used a civil calendar based on a solar year that consisted of 365 days, without making any adjustment for the additional quarter of a day each year. Each year had 12 months and the heliacal rising of Sirius coincided with the highest point of river Nile flood at Memphis marking the first day of the year. The new year of the ancient Egyptians started on Meskerem 1 which is the date is an Ethiopian new year (which also signals the end of Noah's flood). I've always enjoyed the fact that the Kremt rains in Ethiopia are what causes the Nile to flood, and marks the New year in Egypt - which became the New Year for Ethiopia too.

This ancient Egyptian Coptic solar calendar consisted of 12 x 30-day months with five extra festival days at the end of the year. This is the same concept as the Ethiopian Calendar -13 months, 12 of 30 days each and then Pagumay at the end of the year of 5 or 6 days depending whether the year is a leap year or not. The new year starts on 11 September in the Gregorian Calendar (G.C.) or on the 12th in (Gregorian) Leap Years. The Coptic Leap Year follows the same rules as the Gregorian so that the extra month always has 6 days in a Gregorian Leap Year.

The connection between ancient Egypt and Ethiopia is unclear as the extent of territory connected to geographical names such as Nubia and Kush is debatable. However the calendar and artefacts such as the Sistrum have crossed between ancient Empty and Ethiopia so it would seem that there was a significant cultural contact.

The Tesfa Calendar is available with all the Ethiopian dates set into the western calendar. In addition to the Ethiopian dates it shows saints, days fasts, and other holidays. This 340 page book makes an important contribution to historical understandings of pan-African artistic movements and visual culture through its detailed investigation, persuasive argument and richly written style.

Elizabeth W. Giorgis is the former director of the Institute of Ethiopian Studies and the dean of the College of Performing and Visual Art of Addis Ababa University. She is currently associate professor of critical theory and criticism as well as art history at the College of Performing and Visual Art and the Center of African Studies at Addis Ababa University. If modernism initially came to Africa through colonial contact, what does Ethiopia's inimitable historical condition—its independence save for five years under Italian occupationmean for its own modernist tradition? In this book-the first length study of the topic-the author recognizes that her home country's supposed singularity, particularly as it pertains to its history from 1900 to the present, cannot be conceived outside the broader colonial legacy. She uses the evolution of modernist art in Ethiopia to open up the intellectual, cultural, and political histories of it in a pan-African context. Giorgis explores the varied precedents of the country's political and intellectual history to understand the ways in which the import and range of visual narratives were mediated across different moments, and to reveal the conditions that account for the extraordinary dynamism of the visual arts in Ethiopia. The book details how innovations in visual art intersected with shifts in philosophical and ideological narratives of modernity. The book is available in printed format at BookWorld.



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

IN NOVEMBER LAST YEAR, IN RESPONSE TO THE EFFECT OF COVID 19 ON TOURISM IN ETHIOPIA, FOUR TOUR COMPANIES CAME TOGETHER.

To stage a charity bike ride around Ankober in North Shoa creating the name RIDE THE RIFT. The event was run over the weekend with the bike ride climbing from a river bed in the Afar region up the Rift Valley escarpment to Ankober Lodge climbing over 1,500m along 30km of asphalt and gravel road. It was a huge success, raising around half a million birr for guides and cooks who had received no income for the previous 7 months; staging an event for around 50 cyclists who had an awesome weekend.

RIDE THE RIFT went on to organise two more weekends: in January camping to the Jamma gorge area, cycling along canyons in a remote part of North Shoa, and then in March camping to the Gurage Highlands which is dissected by rivers, with beautiful villages and amazing rides, runs or hikes. These weekends were enormously successful, the combination of well run camping, with good food, toilets and showers, and wonderful activities for all the family, meant everyone enjoyed these 'Escapes from Addis'.

RIDE THE RIFT is moving forward into this new Ethiopian year building on the successes of last year. In the first months of the Ethiopian year they are running tours to the Gurage Highlands (24-27 Sep) for the Meskal holiday which is so famous in the region; to the Jamma Gorges (16-20 Oct) to explore this stunning landscape when the many waterfalls are full and the crops are in the fields, and to Ankober again (19-21 Nov) for a new fundraising ride, but with a less gruelling route, and more activities spread over the weekend. For anyone looking for outdoor activities whether biking, running or trekking these adventure weekends are brilliant.

This golden spice has been used for its medicinal, antioxidant, and anti-inflammatory properties for thousands of years. Turmeric tea or turmeric latte is one popular form of consuming turmeric. It has a unique but subtle flavour and is a great way to reap the health benefits of turmeric.

Ethiopia turmeric is a spice from the same family as ginger and it thrives in warm subtropical temperatures and requires a high level of rainfall to grow well which conforms to the agricultural south of Ethiopia. The rhizomes are the main producers of powder that serves as culinary additives. In Amharic culture, the yellow powder is common as a food spicing curry. Its mildly bitter taste is what makes the rhizome a major export from the country. The crop had its original home in southern Asia.

Turmeric (Curcuma longa L.) is one of the most widely grown spice crops in the southwestern part of Ethiopia. Tepi located just over 600km from the capital Addis Ababa claims to be Ethiopia's centre for turmeric. Turmeric has become one of the most important cash crops in Ethiopia.

Ethiopia rhizomes, (usually the mother seed) are cured either through boiling in pure water or by drying them under the hot tropical sun. The best curing usually hardens the product, and provides better distribution of fresh color in the herb. Each boiling or dry curing process takes place no more than a few hours to ensure the pigment is not destroyed.

Turmeric Sauce, also known as Alicha Kulet– is made up on onions, olive oil, turmeric powder, garlic and ginger.

Traditionally, Turmeric Sauce is used as a base for making mild stews (lentils, split peas and meat), and veggies dishes – Just Mix the Turmeric Sauce with lentils, meat or veggies, and some water; cook until the lentils veggies or meat are done; and add salt to taste. THE NOBLE CUP MAKING GIRLS LIVES EASIER

Sara Eklund, whose mother is an Ethiopian entrepreneur and father is an American member of the Peace Corps is the visionary behind introducing the Menstrual Cup to Ethiopian women. A simple cost-effective device and environmentally friendly too.


In Ethiopia, 25% of girls do not use any menstrual health products during their periods, often due to the high cost of disposable pads. According to Sara, many Ethiopian girls use rags, newspapers and sometimes cow dung as homemade alternatives to pads, which result in discomfort and infections. Schools often don't have private bathrooms, running water or trash facilities, making it difficult for girls to wash and dispose of their menstrual products. Because they are unable to manage their periods while at school and must return home, 17% of girls in Ethiopia have reported missing class while on their periods.



Sara founded Noble Cup, which produces and distributes menstrual cups. Through interactive workshops across the country, the organisation teaches women and girls about their reproductive systems, cycles and cramps. They also distribute their own brand of menstrual cups — the first of their kind in Ethiopia. They are less expensive than pads or tampons because they can be reused for five years. They don't create waste, which is important when adequate garbage disposal facilities are sparse. And they require less water to clean than cloth rags, a critical concern in countries that face water shortages, like Ethiopia.

Nobel Prize Laureate Malala Yousafzai was among those who joined a Noble Cup workshop at a high school in the capital Addis Ababa. "I want girls to be able to reframe the conversation around menstruation in their communities and society as a whole," says Eklund and wants her organisation to be accessible for young women — that's why she works to make their branding cute and fun. Noble Cup's slogan, "ሁሉም ጎግስቶች ደደማሉ." translates to "Every queen bleeds; I am a queen, you are a queen, the girl who's cleaning up the street is a queen, your mom is a queen, President Sahle Work Zewde is a queen." One Ethiopian girl at a time through Noble Cup, she can normalise the conversation around periods.

WHY DOES MY CAR FOG UP?

One of the safety and comfort problems when driving is the thermal and visual effect of the air conditioning system. During the winter season it is in high demand. We should first check the operational status of each component in order to use the AC system depending on the weather condition. Your vehicle may fog up covering the whole window in the cold season thus during this season we must use the specified AC system in order to eliminate fog and control the temperature in the car.

Check the following:

- 1. Under the hood check for AC mounting bolts & service mounting ports.
- 2. While engine is running and AC switch is on check if the AC clutch engages or not.
- 3. Blowing only cold air? Check for refrigerant level and pressure in the system using appropriate device.
- 4. Check for knocking and rumbling sounds in the vicinity of the compressor.
- 5. Check that the condenser and radiator are free from obstructions that could reduce air flow and efficiency of AC.

To ensure optimum air conditioning performance, you must examine these individually and contact your technician if it needs additional inspection and maintenance.

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
