# PEACOCK PARK TRANSFORMED INTO ZOO






So now that you know where my inspiration for fashion comes from ....

My next interview highlights one of the pioneer designers from Ethiopia Genet Kebede

After studying fashion design and garment construction in Italy and Argentina, Genet Kebede founded her brand Paradise Fashion which is a well-known fashion brand in Ethiopia established in 1992 almost 30 years ago.



Paradise Fashion is inspired by the love of traditional Ethiopian handweaving textiles, the desire to preserve the beauty of this tradition and the ability to empower women across Ethiopia with sustainable employment opportunities. This inspiration evolved into her Ethiopian fashion line, with unique, beautiful and sustainable women's clothing.

Genet's ethical fashion line combines traditional Ethiopian handwoven fabrics with contemporary design, where she creates limited-production collections of handmade scarves, kaftans, modern Ethiopian dresses and other handmade garments.

The fabrics she uses in her handwoven clothing are as unique as the loom weavers with whom she works, meaning that each item is an exclusive work of Ethiopian art.

Paradise Fashion's product lines include, couture women's wear for weddings and special occasions, beachwear, scarves and shawls as well as Paradise Home that includes pillow cases, decorative throws, wall hangings and table sets.

The brand name paradise is the translation of her name in Amharic GENET. However she is in the process of rebranding it to GENET.

Her advice for young upcoming designers is to love what they do and to update themselves about what is going on in the global fashion world. She says we can learn a lot from social media and especially fashion websites. "If we educate ourselves, we can become competitive in the global fashion market". "WE can be unique".

"Brand legacy is fundamental" to promote the authentic Ethiopian hand weaving textile products and in her case, ladies wear to be recognized globally.

"I have been working hard for the last 29 years for my brand legacy to have a significant value for our handwoven textiles." Genet K.

In conclusion, this half day trip provided an opportunity to test our ability to adventure in the woods and most importantly to discover more about each other's world and gain an afterwards promise to reconnect, visit future art exhibitions and purchase works of art! It is encouraging to participate in these kind of activities.

# Lct's Eat Enebla My favourite Ethiopian Recipes



A "must-read and experience" charming cook book on discovering the basic principles on cooking Ethiopian food.

Sari Nordberg-Tafassa is from Finland but she has lived in Ethiopia since 1976 and is married to an Ethiopian.

She is an illustrator and author of another popular book Kaldi and the Dancing Goats: The Legend of Ethiopian Coffee, making her one of the first English language Ethiopian cookbook authors.

This booklet is short, sweet, artistically laid out and contains cooking wisdom gems. With 22 recipes, it is packed but doesn't overwhelm with redundancy. The recipes span basics like Gomen and Shiro wat as well as classics like spiced beef and less well known to Westerners staples such as Ambasha spiced bread and Doro chicken bread. Mekelesha powder is featured frequently as is pine cone or temeze. There is a nice section on hand washing and coffee rituals. This booklet is a nice introduction to Ethiopian Cuisine and dishes which the Author has cooked and enjoyed. The art alone is quite impressive and descriptive.

It's easy to find the new and revised version of the booklet at BOOKWORLD branches around Addis.

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# ETHIOPIAN POET LEMN SISSAY

HONORED

Lemn Sissay has been named in the Queen's annual Birthday Honours List (UK). The University of Manchester Chancellor, poet and playwright Lemn Sissay, has been awarded an OBE for services to Literature and Charity in the Queen's Birthday Honour's List.

Since taking up the Chancellorship in 2015, Lemn Sissay MBE has contributed to the University significantly on a local, national and international scale. In 2017 he launched the Lemn Sissay Law Bursaries, which aims to address underrepresentation of black males in the legal profession. Further afield, Lemn has helped the University expand our Equity and Merit Scholarships for funded master's degrees to include prospective Ethiopian students. The Sissay PhD Scholarship for Care Leavers has been running for six years and The Lemn Sissay Foundation, established in Manchester, organises Christmas dinners for care leavers in locations across the UK. University President and Vice-Chancellor, Professor Dame Nancy Rothwell said: "I'm sure I speak for our entire university community when I say this is a well deserved honour for Lemn, and we offer him our warmest congratulations. His tireless work for literature goes hand in hand with his role as the University's Chancellor where he has introduced The Lemn Sissay Law Bursary and was instrumental in extending our Equity and Merit Scholarships to Master's students in Ethiopia. He is a well-loved member of the Manchester family and we're delighted to see him get recognition for his work."

The list recognises people who have given exceptional service to the UK abroad and internationally. He detailed his experiences in the British care system in his autobiography of his early life, My Name Is Why.




# GETATCHEW HAILE 1931-2021:

# GE'EZ LANGUAGE SCHOLAR

Getatchew Haile was an Ethiopian-American foremost scholar of the Ge'ez language. He was acknowledged for his contributions to the field with a MacArthur Fellows Program "genius" award and the Edward Ullendorff Medal from the Council of the British Academy. He was the first Ethiopian and the first African to win the award. As a boy, he attended Ethiopian Orthodox church school, where he learned Ge'ez and "devoted his energies to reading and understanding the texts." From 1945 to 1951 he attended Trinity School in Addis Ababa. Haile graduated from the Coptic Theological College, Cairo, Egypt with a B.D.


In 1974, Haile became a member of the transitional
Ethiopian Parliament from Shoa province. Due to his
opposition to the Derg junta, government soldiers came
to his home to arrest him in 1975 during which time he
was shot. After the BBC World Service and Voice of
America reported his arrest, the government released him.



Through the intervention of friends, Haile was allowed to travel to London for medical treatment. However, he became paraplegic due to severe damage to his spinal cord and needed to use a wheelchair.

Haile was associate professor in the Department of Ethiopian Languages and Literature, Haile Selassie I University (now Addis Ababa University), from 1962 to 1969, and 1971 to

It's blackness also controls the sun's glare, and thus it is used by both men and women from the desert area. Kohl is powdered antimony, a brittle metallic elementary body of bright bluish-white colour and flaky crystalline texture. ESB Secret organics prepares and sells both light and darker grades of kohl of fine quality. The "kohl" pencils used in modern makeup are a completely different item and should not be applied in the manner the powder is applied, next to the eye.

# **NEW AYZOT APP:**

# A DOCTOR IN YOUR POCKET

The Ayzot app is a collaboration between Surrey, the University of Strathclyde, Hospice Ethiopia, the Federal Ministry of Health and Hello Doctor Ethiopia, an Ethiopian-based software company run by Dr Yohans Wodaje. 'It's like having a doctor in my pocket'; this was the feedback from one of the patients at Hospice Ethiopia during user testing of the latest version 'Ayzot' a new mobile phone app for palliative care. The app is named after a common Ethiopian expression roughly translated to mean: to encourage or soothe a sick person. The app's focus is on supporting patients with life-limiting illnesses such as cancer and HIV/AIDS by helping them manage pain and other symptoms.

The app features a self-assessment management system that leads the patient or carer through a common set of symptoms such as pain, nausea, drowsiness, breathlessness, tiredness, appetite and well-being. Both patients and carers are encouraged to use the Ayzot app to assess the severity of each symptom using a combination of measures, including the pain assessment scale. The app contains both pharmacological and non-pharmacological medication information and, where appropriate, directs the user to get help and further information on wound care, spiritual care and diet. Patients reported that using the Ayzot app helped them feel more reassured and supported with their pain management and symptom control.

The team behind the Ayzot app is currently looking to secure further funding to perform a feasibility study and test the app in several rural areas across Ethiopia and other African countries. Dr Nicola Carey from the School of Health Sciences at the University of Surrey said: "We hope that Ayzot will be embedded into the national palliative care clinical provision to support healthcare professionals and provide enhanced palliative coverage in Ethiopia."

# GREAT GREEN WALL

In the drylands of Ethiopia and other African countries, people are living on the frontline of the climate crisis. Temperatures are rising, trees are disappearing, the land is becoming infertile and the desert is spreading. The Metema forest in northern Ethiopia is in the last green belt before the start of the desert. But it could be extinct within 20 years. This will have a devastating impact on communities who rely on the forest for food and income. There will be no buffer between them and the encroaching desert. The Metema forest is extra special because of its frankincense trees which provide a lifeline for local communities. In Ethiopia, families can sell frankincense resin for use in essential oils around the world, to make an income. Frankincense trees also boost soil fertility, are drought-hardy and can survive when other crops fail, helping families build resilience to the climate crisis.

The climate crisis, high rates of tree felling and unsustainable tapping for frankincense, is stopping the frankincense forest from regenerating.


The Great Green Wall (www. greatgreenwall.org) is an African-led movement with an epic ambition to grow a wide belt of trees, vegetation and fertile land across the Sahel

Originally envisaged as an 8,000km band of trees, this ambitious project is now much more than that. It is a beacon of biodiverse and sustainably managed land, providing nutritious food and green jobs for the millions of people living along its path. The Great Green Wall is bringing Africa's degraded landscapes back to life and reclaiming the land for people.



### Moist and Easy Carrot Cake recipe

### **INGREDIENTS**

### **INGREDIENTS**

- 11/2CUPS GRANULATED SUGAR
- 1CUP VEGETABLE OIL
- 3EGGS
- 2 CUPS FLOUR
- 2 TEASPOONS GROUND CINNAMON
- 1 TEASPOON BAKING SODA
- 1 TEASPOON VANILLA
- 1/2TEASPOON SALT
- 3 CUPS SHREDDED CARROTS (5 MEDIUM)
- 1 CUP COARSELY CHOPPED WALNUTS (OPTIONAL)

### **PREPARATION**

Heat oven to 350°F.

Grease bottom and sides of one 13x9-inch pan or two 8-inch or 9-inch round pans with shortening; lightly flour. In large bowl, beat granulated sugar, oil and eggs with electric mixer on low speed about 30 seconds or until blended. Add flour, cinnamon, baking soda, 1 teaspoon vanilla and the salt; beat on low speed 1 minute. Stir in carrots and nuts. Pour into pan(s).

Bake 13x9-inch pan 40 to 45 minutes, round pans 30 to 35 minutes, or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean.

Cool rectangle in pan on cooling rack. Cool rounds 10 minutes; remove from pans to cooling rack.

It is good just as it is - no frosting required (optional extra)

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
