AFRICAN MOSAIQUE FASHION FESTIVAL

On October 23 and 24, 2021 the Fifth Annual African Mosaique Fashion Festival and Award Ceremony will take place at the African Mosaique Design Center and Manufacturing Hub, Legetafo. A two-day festival with a fashion show and exciting shopping experience (featuring some of Ethiopia's creative emerging talent and awardwinning established designers) plus a Pop-Up shop highlighting other artisans Guests will be able to meet the designers hear their inspiring stories, network and shop. The event will follow proper COVID protocol to protect the safety of guests and participants.

African Mosaique Design Center and Manufacturing Hub, the first of its kind in Ethiopia, will continue celebrating local Fashion while identifying and promoting emerging designers, as well as providing training, production, and showcasing facilities for emerging and established designers alongside networking and business facilitation. This year we are featuring a total of 20 designers both established and emerging designers, including graduate designers from the fifth cycle of the African Mosaique Incubator program AMFI who will launch their labels.

African Mosaique Plc., is primarily a high end-fashion and clothing production enterprise, export- oriented, registered in Ethiopia and operational in the Legetafo area on the outskirts of Addis Ababa. AM designs, manufactures and markets high end, value added garments, with fabrics and other raw materials sourced primarily from Ethiopian and other African textiles mills. The company also provides mentorship and collaborates with up and coming young designers and entrepreneurs in the fashion and apparel industry. It serves as a platform to emerging and established Ethiopian and other African designers, by providing on-job training, transfer of knowledge and marketing opportunities. Following its acquisition in 2015 of 9 000 square meters of land in a light industry area on the outskirts of Addis Ababa, AM has built an integrated design center and manufacturing hub.. The center and hub produces thousands of designs and garments each year, as well as provides training, production and showcasing facilities for other designers.

1. Introduce who you are and your brand name. When did you start your brand?



y name is Sewasw Hailu, my brand's name is Sewasew Design. Driven with the passion for fashion, I started my company around 18/ years ago.

2. Where is your brand now and the story behind your brand. Within 18 years of ups and downs, there was a gap of 5

years when my company was forced to close. But in 2020, my son Ablene Dawit quit his job and we gathered our savings to start making face masks. In the past year, o ur team has grown from 2 people to 13 full time w omen employees.

3. I have noticed that most of your current collection is all made with Gabi Material, so why Gabi?

I have always loved Gabi, I love the texture, the color, and the craftsmanship of making it.

4. How do you define Ethiopian fashion?

I would define it as a very young market that has the opportunity to employ many, women, youths and underprivileged people.

artefacts that were looted at Ethiopian the Battle of Maqdala in 1868 have been officially handed over to Ethiopian Embassy in London by the Scheherazade Foundation. The items include a handwritten Ethiopian Bible, crosses, an Imperial shield, a set of beakers, an icon and a magical scroll, were procured by the Scheherazade Foundation through a Dorset-based auction house, and private dealers in mainland Europe. Speaking on the occasion, at a private reception held at the prestigious Athenaeum Club in London, Ethiopian Ambassador Teferi Melesse Desta thanked the Foundation for their work in acquiring the precious items and renewed calls for museums, collectors, and holders of Maqdala heritage to return these items to their rightful home. Founder of the Scheherazade Foundation, Mr Tahir Shah, on his part, said he knew what the return of the objects would mean to the people of Ethiopia and that through his foundation, he hopes to build bridges between thetwo nations. The Embassy will now make arrangements for the items to be returned to Ethiopia in due course.

s you reach the gate of Teferi Mekonnen School (TMS), now called the Entoto Polytechnic College, you're greeted with the welcoming faces of the guards followed by a request to leave your ID cards. Once you begin the long walk in the college compound,

the heavenly tranquillity, the cold breeze with the scent of plants from the garden, along with the beautiful view of the historic building, complemented with sculptures made by students, you notice how it creates a magnificent ambience making you stand still, take your time and admire it all.

The school building itself constructed under Negus Teferi's order, was designed to educate young Ethiopians in modern education. It was one of the first public buildings in Addis Ababa during the Pre-Italian period. Its architectural style and construction techniques are quite unique and one amongst few of its kind in the city of Addis Abeba with Its historical function still continuing to this day. The Visual Arts and the Music departments were added in 2007, and have graduated students since 2010.

Our visit today focuses on

the Visual Arts department which accepts 40-50 students for three-year courses. Quite a number of students who graduated from the Arts department have joined Alle Fine Art

Teferi Mekonnen school was founded in 1925 by the Regent Teferi Mekonnen: the future Emperor Haileselassie I.

School (AAU) to further their education in BSC and MCS degree programs. Talented artists have Graduated to go on and become studio artists that have exhibit their work locally and internationally.

The Art department has Graphics, Painting and Sculpture training departments. The students' work and their talent is impeccable and is well identified by dedicated trainers that have the intricate skill set to identify students' talent and the encouraging disposition. The fatherly guidance and the year round art exhibition in the main hall of the Arts department building along with the monthly panel discussion (lecture series) by successful artists makes the school unique in its teaching methods.

TMS is the place to visit. The historic building, the art exhibitions, the sculptures in the compound and the monthly lecture series are open to visitors. I highly recommend anyone who is an art lover to take a look at it for themselves.

To conclude, I would like to thank the Ministry of Education for understanding the value of art and culture and create these art departments in the college. My only wish is to see these kind of colleges in greater numbers soon.

uthor Sam McManus has collated 15-years' worth of adventure travel writing in Ethiopia, Japan, Bolivia, Egypt, Kyrgyzstan, Iran, Mongolia, Lebanon, Oman & Costa Rica in this collection of travel stories, which revolve around a central solo journey exploring the mountains of Ethiopia over a three-month period in 2015. "The most prized form of Ethiopian Amharic prose and poetry, loosely translated as 'wax and gold' ሰያምና ወርቅ [saam-enna warq], is meticulously comprised with a focus on the duality of its meanings. The surface meaning, the wax, must be stripped away to reveal the hidden core of gold underneath. Ethiopia as a country also encourages you to look deeper within yourself, to fully understand and appreciate a deeply rich spiritual significance, that often resonates beneath simple or plain exteriors".

His exploration of Ethiopia led to the founding of sustainable adventure travel company Yellow Wood Adventures.

Sam briefed the Ethiopian Ambassador in London about his travel company and writing his book. McManus grew up in the countryside of Kent in the UK until he walked out one midsummer morning into a lifetime of travel and adventure. He has always favoured the road less travelled. Be it the highest plateau in Africa, ice-climbing in the Tian Shan Mountains or exploring the lost assassins' castles in the Alborz Mountains of Iran; a veritable mountain of banana sandwiches, history books, novels, travel writings and biographies always accompany these adventures, and wherever possible a horse or two.

> atients are receiving treatment at the Chinese backed Tirunesh Beijing Hospital/Ethio Chinese Friendship Hospital in Addis Ababa. "The Chinese doctors use acupuncture, cupping, moxibustion and other techniques to treat neck, shoulder, waist and leg pains, nerve

dysfunction and some mental and psychological disorders," said Liu Ruiqiang, who is the leader of the 22nd batch of hinese Medical Team in Ethiopia. According to the team leader, the two highly experienced Chinese acupuncturists can treat about 25 Ethiopian patients a day, helping more than 700 locals relieve from physical pains every month. "We have been treating diseases such as body, muscle and joint pains, paralysis, and migraine since our arrival at the hospital's acupuncture treatment center nine months ago," said Lin Guoping, one of the Chinese acupuncturists. Lin said he sees an increasing number of patients who are referred to the center and undergo acupuncture therapy, an ancient Chinese medicine-based approach to treating a variety of conditions by triggering specific points on the skin with needles. Apart from treating the locals, the acupuncture center serves as a platform where Chinese doctors are imparting the knowledge of Traditional Chinese Medicine to fellow Ethiopian health professionals. Seble Mamo, who serves as the chief Ethiopian acupuncturist in the center, said the Chinese acupuncture is reaching more needy people, helping to cure locals from a variety of illnesses such as headaches, blood pressure, and sleeping problems, among others. "Unlike other modern-day treatments, the acupuncture therapy is much preferable among Ethiopians as it is administered without side-effects," said Mamo. Mamo said she is happy working with the Chinese acupuncturists from whom she draws good knowledge and experience. She recommends the acupuncture health education to be given in Ethiopian universities to serve the over 110 million population of the east African nation.

REMEMBERING "ETHIOPIAN ELVIS" SINGER ALEMAYEHU ESHETE



orn and raised in Jimma in 1941, the singer rose to fame in the 1960s, matching his Ethiopian heritage against jazz improvisation and a soulful appeal. Performing with the famed Police Orchestra in Addis Ababa, Alemayehu Eshete enjoyed his first hit 'Seul'

in 1961 before going on to form his own Alem-Girma Band. Releasing 30 singles across a 15 year period, he then went on to gain fame and a new following in Europe and the US with the release of Buda Musique's Ethiopiques series, whose Volume 9 was devoted entirely to Eshete's early recordings.

He was one of the first Ethiopian singers to compose songs in English and other foreign languages. Temar Lije" or "My Son, You Had Better Learn" is one of his popular songs that motivated many to acquire modern education. The popular song is still used by Ethiopian parents to discipline and counsel their children, and to raise awareness on the importance of education. In 2015, the song won an award in Germany. He also won the Lifetime Achievement Award for his work in Ethiopia. His stylish dress code and hairstyle made him popular among the youth in the 1960s and 1970s. Eshete was one of the first musicians to record music to vinyl in Ethiopia. The musician was involved in writing, recording, and touring until the very end of his life it has been reported.

CASH FOR WORK PROGRAM IN THE SIMIENS

undation (AWF) is running a cash for The African Wildlife F work program in the Sir has seen over 170 comr nien Mountains National Park that nunity members gain income from rehabilitating the U.N ducational, Scientific and Cultural O) World Heritage Site in Ethiopia. The Organization (UNESC rehabilitation activities are divided into two pillars: vegetation restoration and soil and water conservation. At the hear of this activity is community engagement, providing jobs hundreds whose incomes have plummeted as a result of the decline of tourism due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. Community engagement is important when it comes to the management of natural resources and the conservation of protected areas. This conservation model ensures that wildlife and wild lands thrive and, in return, become a source of livelihood for the community members adjacent to the protected areas. Conservation is a community empowering tool. The ongoing COVID-19 pandemic has had an adverse impact on Africa's tourism industry, losing revenues for protected areas and leaving them with little resources to run operations, while also plunging community members into poverty. AWF launched the Cash for Work Program to provide an alternative source of livelihood for the affected local community members living near the Simien Mountains National Park. Since the onset of the rehabilitation activities, AWF has engaged a total of 177 community members from <mark>around the</mark> protected area, 105 for gully treatment and 72 in preparation of pits for plantation.

The beneficiaries include wildlife scouts who lost their jobs due to the pandemic as well as other community members not traditionally working in conservation but are now involved in follow-up and seedling management in the permanent nursery site in the park supported by AWF.

Simien Mountains National Park has been under serious threat from the expansion of settlement, cultivation, overgrazing, and deforestation, and associated problems. These anthropogenic pressures result in the deterioration of the park habitats and increase the formation of gullies and other land degradation features. AWF is promoting land-use planning and soil and water conservation as a key component of restoration activities. AWF prioritizes the use of science coupled with indigenous knowledge in the restoration of the Simien Mountains National Park.

DID YOU KNOW

CHECK UP FOR YOUR CAR

1.Coolant quality and check up

If your cooling system fluid is not replaced with new, corrosion can damage the heater core, radiator and other parts in the system. So keep driving until something fails and costs you a lot of money to fix, or change the coolant every two years or refill with a "universal" coolant that can be used in all makes/models of vehicles and prolong the life of your cooling system. Use the same type of antifreeze that is in your cooling system now.

2.Transmission Fluid quality and check up


Many vehicles have a recommended service interval for transmission fluid. Even so, heat and hard use can still cause the fluid to oxidize and break down. Because of this, many transmission experts say you can prolong the life of your transmission by changing the fluid every 50,000 Km. Be sure to use the type of Automatic and manual transmission fluid specified for your transmission.

3.Brake Fluid quality and check up

After long time brake service brake fluid becomes contaminated that lowers the fluid's boiling point and increases the risk of the fluid property and causing the pedal to fade under hard use. Corrosion inhibitors in the fluid also break down over time, which allows to corrode and affect the brake calipers, wheel cylinders, master cylinder, steel brake lines and the ABS hydraulic unit. Even so, changing the fluid every three to five years can reduce the risk of fluid overheating and pedal fade, prevent corrosion and prolong the life of your brake system.

COMMUNITY TREKKING IN WOF WASHA FOREST

his is an ancient forest protected since King Zera Yacob, with the super forest in Afro Alpine vegetation at over 3,000m (peaks at 3,600) and dropping down through Juniper Olive and Podocarpus forest to below 2,500m It is a short

drive to Debre Berhan, and then the now almost completely asphalted road to to trail heads for the treks into the forest. There are 4 guesthouses, two higher up and two lower down in the forest. You can make this a weekend escape (nice to include Friday afternoon) or a longer trip.

A Land of Milk & Honey, and much more; Wof Washa forest blankets over 6,000 hectares of the Rift Valley escarpment with natural forest. Its only 130km north east from Addis Ababa, and the forest extends from Ankober (seat of Emperor Menelik's former palace) towards Debre Sina. Here an NGO called SUNARMA has supported forest cooperatives to develop guesthouses to accommodate tourists around the forest. Tesfa Tours has signed an agreement with these cooperative to market and manage the bookings for this wonderful trekking setup.

At the highest levels (around 3,500 meters above sea level) the forest consists of Afro-alpine vegetation: Giant Lobelia and Giant Heather trees (Erica arboreal). As you go lower increasingly there are massive Juniper, African Olive, Podocarpus, Hagenia Abysinica (Kosso), Hypericum and many other species. Some of these trees are over 500 years old. With the changing altitude was a variety wildlife. At the top of the escarpment was Guassa grassland with little rodents



scuttling into burrows before us and large troops of Geladas. Reliable reports indicate that Ethiopian wolves can be seen here too best seen early morning and late afternoon. The great raptors patrol the escarpments on thermals in search of rodents or Rock hyrax (which look like overgrown guinea pigs). As you descend into the forest down on the escarpment edge it rapidly warms up and the lower altitude trees appear. In addition to the trees you will notice a myriad of different coloured flowers. Anyone with an interest in plants will be fascinated and be scrabbling for their notebooks. The regular rain with the varied altitude make this one of the best places to see flowers and different plants. In terms of mammals, lower down are Colobus monkeys, heard Hamadryas baboons, Grivet (a type of vervet) monkeys, leopards (you will be lucky to see them but may hear their cough or see their spore), hyenas, tree hyrax, Cerval and Civet cats,

enelik's bushbuck Porcupines – and more. Among the birds you will be excited to see the White-cheeked Turacos with their scarlet wings. At the lower levels there is agricultural land abutting the forest – green a verdant, with the jagged forested peaks rising behind. Low level fields maybe full of crops such as barley a bean called Bakela. And all the while water gurgles by in streams.
